And, we just finished designing a new banner that will identify us at these events. In order to serve you better, we will be expanding our Board of Directors by adding 2 new members and looking to all of you to help us build teams that can continue our dynamic momentum!

We are also celebrating 6 new SDRC members who bring us to a total of 12 so far this year. Just a reminder that paid membership in SDRC brings you the benefits of being able to have your name listed on our website. Any classes/workshops you are promoting will also be listed on the website and emailed out to the entire membership directly. If you are interested in participating in the Sharp Reiki experience, we would love to have you! Our daily referrals have increased from 5-6 per day up to 15-20 per day. One of our new practitioners, Jude Barnes, RN, works every Tuesday morning in the Surgical Procedure Area (known as the SPA) and routinely performs Reiki treatments on 19 patients, care givers, and staff. She also refers patients who will be admitted after surgery for Reiki treatments while they are in the hospital. She reminds us that she can do 19 treatments because she does not have to walk far between rooms and has to keep her treatments to about 5 minutes to accommodate the craziness of the pre-op setting. We have also been invited to expand the basic program to include the Sharp Rehab facility and are looking for new people to join us there. The doctors and nurses have been so impressed with the effects of Reiki on their patients, that the doctors are now including Reiki in their orders!

How to Find the Right Reiki Teacher

I received a call the other day from a young man who said he was interviewing for "a Reiki teacher who does attunements." He went on to say, "I'm gathering information on (Reiki) masters and venues to figure out which is best for me." This call prompted me to write about how to find the right Reiki teacher; I got the impression from our short conversation that he was more interested in getting "attuned" than taking the necessary steps/class to become a Reiki practitioner.

First, consider that you attract into your life the right person for you at the right time, always, for whatever lesson(s) need to be learned.

Here are some guidelines to use in your search for the right Reiki teacher for you. While there may be many questions you would like to ask in your interview, the following, I think, are the more pertinent. By the way, before you even begin your search, please ask yourself why you want to learn to do Reiki. If your (honest) answer is less than altruistic, you might want to consider looking elsewhere for a new interest.

- How long has the teacher been practicing Reiki? **Teaching?** This assumes the person you are speaking to has gone through the necessary three levels of Reiki instruction, to mastership. It is the Reiki master who has the knowledge to give you a correct attunement for the level of Reiki you are completing, and can guide you in how to give a proper Reiki treatment. Choosing a person who says they have been a Reiki master for 20 years over someone who has only five years, for example, does not necessarily make one better than the other. Yes, 20 years is an impressive number, but has that person been practicing, studying and teaching all that time? Or, has their Reiki been a sometime thing? A Reiki master with only five years of experience may have the experience you need to understand the nuances of the Reiki energy and how to handle situations as they come up. More on that in the following steps.
- Is the teacher affiliated with a hospital, hospice, or clinic? Volunteering in a clinical environment will give a teacher a wider sense of familiarity in giving Reiki

treatments to patients who have varying energy deficiencies.

- Does the teacher perform a daily centering, meditative ritual or routine? Training the mind to be still and at peace is an added benefit to giving a Reiki treatment. Although Reiki can be given without this preparation, stilling the mind so that it can focus solely on the patient/client at hand will allow the energy to flow freely and unhindered.
- Does the teacher practice self-healing (Reiki) on themselves every day? Reiki self-treatment is essential for anyone who is serious about practicing or teaching Reiki. Becoming in tune with the energy in your body helps you expand and deepen your sense of awareness of Reiki energy.
- What type of Reiki does the teacher practice? You'll want to be sure that your teacher has come from the lineage begun by Dr. Mikao Usui, in Japan, and subsequently Mrs. Hawayo Takata who brought Reiki to the West.
- What is covered in the class? How many hours? Will there be hands-on practice? The Reiki master should be able to give you an overview of the class you are signing up for.
- What is an attunement? Again, the Reiki master should be able to give you a brief idea of what an attunement encompasses and why it is given.
- Will the Reiki master be available for questions, after the class is over? Reiki is learned by doing. The more Reiki you practice, the more confident you become. When beginning, however, there are always questions about your practice. You'd like to have someone to reach out to.
- Does the Reiki master belong to a support group you can join? It benefits all Reiki practitioners to belong to a Reiki support group where you can meet other practitioners, trade information, ask questions, and learn about opportunities available to you within the community.

I hope these guidelines help you in your pursuit of the right Reiki teacher for you. Have you attracted the right person into your life at this time? Only you will know.
